FRESHMAN ADMISSION POLICY AND PROCEDURES

PROCEDURES

All freshman applicants must submit the following to the Office of Admissions:

1. Completed Application for Undergraduate Admission;
2. Official high school transcripts or GED scores; (Official transcripts must be signed and dated within the last five years. Transcripts may be delivered in a sealed envelope, through electronic data transfer, or by fax directly from granting institution's records office with cover page.)
3. \$50 non-refundable application fee that will be applied to your first tuition bill.
(Make check payable to Eastern Oregon University. If using a credit card please call the Office of Admissions);
4. Official SAT or ACT test scores if applicable. See below to determine what tests are required;
5. Sealed official college transcripts (if applicable); and
6. Any other documents required per instructions below.

REQUIREMENTS

Grade Point Average

- Students will be admitted to EOU with a 3.00 GPA in the 14 subject requirements when all other admission requirements are met.
- Students will be considered for admission to EOU with a 2.75 – 2.99 GPA in the 14 subject requirements with a 1470 SAT Reasoning or 21 ACT.
- Students not meeting the above requirements please refer to the Individual Admissions Review procedure outlined below.

High School Subject Requirements Entering first-year students must satisfactorily (C- or above) complete the following subjects by high school graduation.

College Preparatory Subjects	Minimum Units	
English	4 Units	Shall include the study of the English language, literature, speaking, listening, and writing, with an emphasis on and frequent practice in writing expository prose all four years.
Mathematics	3 Units	Shall include first-year algebra and two additional years of college preparatory mathematics selected from geometry (deductive or descriptive), advanced topics in algebra, analytical geometry, finite mathematics, advanced applications, calculus, probability and statistics, or courses that integrate topics from two or more of these areas. One unit is highly recommended in the senior year. Algebra and geometry taken prior to the ninth grade will be accepted.
Social Studies	3 Units	Shall include one year of U.S. history, one year of global studies (world history, geography, etc.), and one year of social studies elective (government is strongly recommended).
Science	2 Units	Shall include a year each in two fields of college preparatory science such as biology, chemistry, physics, or earth and physical science, one recommended as a laboratory science.
Second Language	2 Units	Two years of the same high school-level second language, or a C- or above in the third year of a high school second language, or two terms of a college level language with a grade of C- or above, or satisfactory performance on an approved assessment of second language knowledge and/or proficiency. Demonstrated proficiency in American Sign Language is acceptable. <i>Note: Students who graduated from high school prior to 1997 may replace the second language with 2 units of other college preparatory courses.</i>

Individual Admissions Review

Students who do not meet the admissions requirements may be asked to submit one or more of the following:

- A personal statement of 300-500 words explaining their circumstances, educational goals and reasons for choosing EOU.
- One or more letters of recommendation from a counselor, teacher or employer who can address the probability of their academic success.
- Other evidence of academic and community service achievement.

The Admissions Committee will review all documents and assess the probability of academic success and may prescribe coursework and remediation activities as conditions for enrollment.

All documents must be received 30 days prior to the beginning of the desired term of attendance to allow time for review.

Test Requirements

First-year applicants who have graduated from an accredited high school within three years must submit SAT Reasoning or ACT scores. Test scores are used to determine course placement and eligibility for scholarships but are not a factor in the selection process for fully qualified applicants. Test scores are evaluated when consideration is given to applicants not meeting the minimum high school subject GPA requirement (3.00). (Note: Online education applicants are not required to submit SAT or ACT scores for admission purposes. However, they are strongly encouraged to complete writing and math placement testing.)

Non-accredited High School and Home-schooled Students

Students who did not graduate from an accredited high school and home-schooled students will be considered for admission by achieving:

- A minimum composite score of 1470 SAT Reasoning or 21 on the ACT Enhanced AND
- An average of 470 or above (1410 total) on three College Board SAT II Subject Tests (Math Level I or IIC, and two tests of the student's choice).
- Students not meeting the above requirements must apply under Individual Admissions Review.

Returning Adult Applicants

Applicants who graduated from high school prior to 1985 must meet the minimum GPA requirement for entering first-year students; high school subject requirements are waived. Students who graduated from high school between 1985 and 1996 are required to have two years of college prep courses which may include second language, computer science, fine and performing arts or other college prep electives, which may at the discretion of the admitting institution, include a comprehensive sequence of units in a vocational-technical area of study.

GED

Students who apply on the basis of GED scores must:

- Achieve an average score of at least 510 (51 if taken prior to Jan. 2002) and score at least a 410 on each five subject tests (41 if taken prior to Jan. 2002.)
- Students who took the GED 1997 or later must also meet the second language requirement as described above.

Transfer Admission Policy and Procedures

To be admitted, all transfer applicants must:

1. Submit the Application for Admission;
2. Official transcripts from all schools attended; (Official transcripts must be signed and dated within the last five years. Transcripts may be delivered in a sealed envelope, through electronic data transfer, or by fax directly from the granting institution's records office with cover page.)
3. \$50 non-refundable application fee that will be applied to your first tuition bill. (Make check payable to Eastern Oregon University. If using a credit card please call the Office of Admissions);
4. Have a 2.25 cumulative GPA or better in a minimum of 30 transferable quarter credits from an accredited college;
5. Have successfully completed a minimum of two courses in the sciences, social sciences, or humanities; and
6. Students who graduated from high school 1997 and beyond must submit an official their high school transcript for second language evaluation. Students who did not satisfy the second language requirement in high school must have two terms of the same college-level second language or satisfactory performance on an approved second language assessment. Demonstrated proficiency in American Sign Language is acceptable in meeting the second language requirement. If students do not have the second language requirement, two terms of college-level second language (with a C- or better) at Eastern Oregon University will be required prior to graduation.

Applicants with fewer than 30 transferable quarter credits must:

1. Have a 2.25 cumulative GPA for all transferable credit, and
2. Fulfill Freshman Admission Procedures and Requirements.

Evaluation of Transfer Credit

Upon receipt of a complete application and transcripts from all prior colleges, an evaluation of transfer credit, known as the "Transfer Evaluation," will be prepared. A copy will be provided to both the student and their academic adviser upon admission. Work from post-secondary schools not accredited by one of the regional accrediting bodies recognized by the Council on Post-Secondary Accreditation will be evaluated upon request, but will not be applied to the student's EOU record until after successful completion of 35 EOU quarter hours. The evaluation may be requested through the Office of Admissions. The Registrar will determine transferability of up to 12 credits earned in vocational-technical courses.

Lower division credits transferred from community colleges which may be counted toward the student's EOU baccalaureate is limited to 120 credits. For additional information, refer to the current Eastern Oregon University academic catalog online at www.eou.edu/catalog/.

Note: Students transferring with fewer than 30 hours of transferable credit must also submit a high school transcript. Students having 0-11 transferable credits will be admitted on their high school record. Students with 12-29 transferable credits must meet both high school and transfer requirements. The student must request in writing that every college or university he/she has ever attended (whether or not credits were earned) send official transcripts to the Office of Admissions, Eastern Oregon University, One University Boulevard, La Grande, OR 97850. The Office of Admissions will notify the student of their admission status as soon as all required documents are received and evaluated. Be sure to list all colleges attended on Section 15 of the application (whether or not credits were earned).

All Other Categories

Students from the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM)

In addition to the above admission requirements students from the Federated States of Micronesia are required to demonstrate English language proficiency by:

1. Submitting official TOEFL scores and achieving 520 on the written exam or 190 on the computer; or 70 overall on the internet-based TOEFL with a minimum of 14 in each section; or
2. A score of 6 on the IELTS; or
3. Satisfactory completion of level 112 in an English Language School; or
4. Receiving a grade of B or better in WR 121 from a U.S. college or university.

Non-Admitted Students

Students who are not working toward a degree or certification and are in good academic standing at EOU may register for eight (8) credits or less per term without being admitted as a student. A student who is interested in a degree or certification should apply for admission at the Office of Admissions. Non-admitted students must complete the online Web Form. This requires no application fee or transcripts. **Non-admitted students are not eligible to receive financial aid.**

Post-Baccalaureate Students

If the student has received a baccalaureate from an accredited institution and wishes to enroll in more than eight credit hours per quarter of undergraduate or graduate courses offered by the university, the student must file an Application for Admission. List all colleges/universities attended on the application and submit an official transcript from the degree granting institution and any post-baccalaureate credits. Admission as a post-baccalaureate student, however, does not constitute acceptance as a candidate for a Master's Degree. Students wishing to apply for one of the Master's Degrees must submit an Application for Graduate Admission status to the Office of Admissions and an application to the graduate program of their choice to the College of Education and Business. **Contact the College of Education and Business for an application: Eastern Oregon University, One University Boulevard, La Grande, OR 97850-2807, 541-962-3772.**

Post-Baccalaureate Non-Graduate Students

A holder of an accredited baccalaureate, who has not been admitted to a graduate degree program and who submits an official application for admission to pursue a second baccalaureate or enrolls in course work not to be used for graduate credit, will be assessed tuition at undergraduate rates after completing the correct form in the Registrar's Office. Students in the education programs who are admitted to the 45-hour standard certificate program are not eligible for the post-baccalaureate, non-graduate student status. Check with the Registrar's Office to establish your status.

Previously Admitted EOU Students Returning After Absence

Students who have previously been admitted to EOU, and have attended classes, should not use this application. If the student has attended any other college or university since leaving EOU, the student must request in writing that official transcripts be sent from each institution directly to the Office of Admissions.
