## In the Nomad's Wake: Teaching My Way Around the World by Invitation and Trespass for Semester at Sea

From January through May 2009, Mark taught English-Writing, Media Studies and Film-Making aboard the M.V. Explorer, the ship carrying 740 students for Semester at Sea, the program sponsored by the University of Virginia. Ports included: Miami, Florida; Nassau, Bahamas; Cadiz, Spain; Casablanca, Morocco; Walvis Bay, Namibia; Capetown, South Africa; Port Louis, Mauritius; Chennai, India; Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon), Viet Nam; Bangkok, Thailand; Phnom Penh, Cambodia; Hong Kong, China; Shanghai, China; Kobe, Japan; Yokohama, Japan; Honolulu, Hawaii; Puerto Quetzal, Guatemala; and Fort Lauderdale, Florida. This Colloquium will examine what it's like to teach writing and media-intensive courses carefully linked to community service field trips.
