Creative & Philosophical Inquiry into Apocalyptic Preoccupation**

Walter will discuss human preoccupation with the end of the world and how his inquiry into its origins informs the evolution and creation of his present literary work-in-progress. In a glimpse inside his creative process, Walter will share his method as well as elaborate upon his inquiry into apocalyptic preoccupation from social, psychological, and theoretical points of perspective. Drawing upon the scholarship of other apocalyptic thinkers, Walter's novel employs meta-fictional prose to further examine both the implicit and overt motivations for apocalyptic imagining, and supposes a utopian foundation for the literary and social discourse on the end of the world. Assuming that the world does not come to its end before the 28th of May, he will be pleased to share all this with you then.
