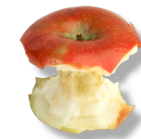


Courses from the College of Arts and Sciences at EOU — Fall 2010

A Major in Media Arts gives students foundational preparation for understanding and analyzing the aesthetic, theoretical, and digital paradigms that inform a wide range of media. The Media Arts program emphasizes the intersection of aural, technological, textual, and visual literacies within the interdisciplinary liberal arts programs involved. Students are prepared for entry into media-oriented fields such as journalism, broadcast writing, scriptwriting, film and multimedia production, audio production, web-authoring, and advertising, or for entry into more specialized graduate programs in film, communication, or new media.



Course Focus: American National Government POLS 101 (10-10:50) M-F

The course examines the historical foundations of our system of democratic government; contemporary federal government structure and practice; and the interaction between the mass media and politicians in the electoral process. The ultimate goal of the course is to provide students with a critical understanding of our political system so they can become more informed and active citizens.
