

MULTIDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

Registration Strategy

Freshman Year

Below 100-level Math, if needed

Writing 115, 121 as needed

Science sequence (100- or 200 level)

Spanish or German, if interested in BA or minor

100-level Math courses, if interested in Math or Math Studies minors

Other 100/200 level MUD coursework - avoid History & Psych until WR 121

Foundational course/s in any potential minor

200-level math - begin when eligible to do so

ED 142 (Intro to Education, 1 credit) – optional, but recommended during 1st yr

ED 242 - as early as Spring term of Freshman year.

These courses make good schedule fillers (and are available frequently)

HW\$ 250/298, SPCH/THEA, and ED 130

PEH 180/201, Music activity & INTACT classes

ED 209 (1 or more credits) – Criminal records check may slow down actual practicum placement

Sophomore Year

Continue MUD general education coursework and Required Competencies

2nd Science sequence

200-level Math, if eligible

Academic Minor coursework, if lower division

ED 242 (Education Concepts, 3 credits)

ED 209 (Practicum, 1 or more credits) - optional

Junior and Senior Years

Complete lower division coursework, where needed

Upper division coursework for Academic minor

Elementary Education minor (Cores- 3 full-time terms)
