ART 341: Intaglio

An introduction to intaglio techniques (a printmaking process using an incised image) with emphasis on development of technical expertise as applied to the expression of personal aesthetic direction. This course will emphasize non-toxic innovations in the field, as well as digital and/or photo imaging.

Join the Eastern Oregon University Wind Ensemble, a select instrumental ensemble open to registered students who play woodwind, brass, and percussion instruments. 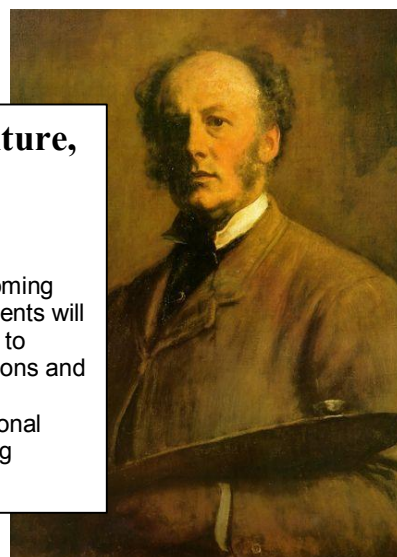
Argumentation

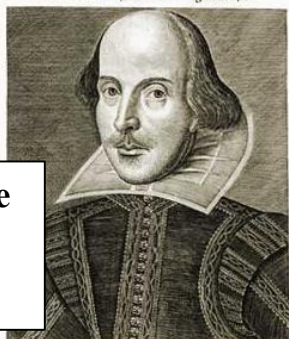

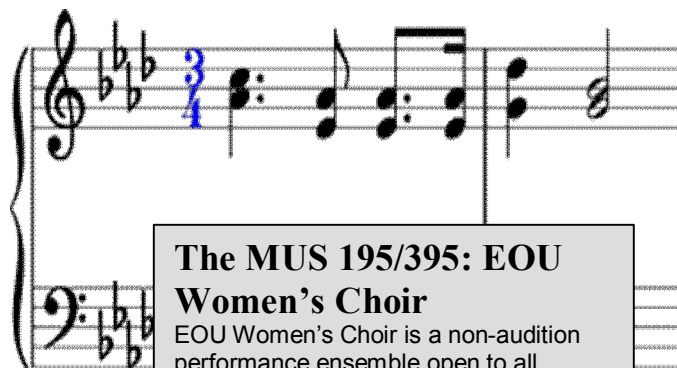
Read and study selected comedies, tragedies, and historical plays of the famous and infamous Bard.
