

Thank you for your interest in our Master's of Teacher Education (MTE) Program.

The MTE Program is a graduate teacher preparation program designed to help students obtain initial Oregon licensure in either a primary/elementary or middle/secondary level authorization *and* to enable students to earn a Master's of Teacher Education Degree.

The College of Education's full-time, intensive teacher preparation program blends professional knowledge gained through experience in classroom settings with continuing academic preparation. In order to acquire a variety of experiences and to increase future job opportunities, our students normally participate in placements at two levels of authorization in public school classrooms. Students begin their placements at the beginning of the school year at assigned school sites in central and eastern Oregon and progress through a full-time internship. During summer classes, after completion of the school year internship, students complete coursework required for the master's degree.

MTE Program Overview

- Attend on-campus Summer Session classes that begin during mid-July.
- Complete internship with two or more experienced teachers, at two different levels of authorization, throughout the school year.
- Attend on-campus graduate level classes as a member of a cohort.
- Attend on-campus Summer Session classes after completion of the school year internship.
