Admission Requirements

Admission requirements are as follows:

1. Apply and be admitted to the Master of Science program.
2. Apply and be admitted to the Graduate program at Eastern Oregon University.
3. Have a GPA of at least 3.0 for the last 60 credit hours completed in either Upper Division or 3.0 in 15 graded credits of approved Graduate courses.
4. Complete the GRE with a minimum combined score of 1000 (e.g., 500 in the Verbal Score and 500 in the Quantitative Score) and a minimum of 4.5 on the Analytical Writing (see Notes below).

Note: For students with GRE score reports prior to October 1, 2002 (the inception of the Analytical Writing section) the previous Quantitative and Verbal scores will be allowed; however, applicant's are required to take the Analytical Writing test before being fully considered.

Note: All GRE/GPAs not meeting the combined score will be reviewed. A sliding scale will be used to review applications. For example, the following cases will be considered but not guaranteed admission.

Combined GRE Score	GPA Requirement
1000 + 4.5	3.0
900 + 3.5	3.5
800 + 3	3.9

Students who fail to achieve a required GRE and GPA combination that is acceptable will not be admitted to the MS program. They will have the following options:

- a. Re-take the GRE and submit an acceptable score.
- b. Improve the GPA. Students need a minimum of 15 graded graduate credits in order to be reconsidered.
- c. Following completion of "a" or "b", the student will re-apply to the MS program. In some cases, new GRE scores will be required. The new GRE score and/or the 15 credits of graduate coursework will be adjudicated in consideration for admission to the program.

Transfer Credits

All courses taken prior to admission will be reviewed for appropriateness of transfer into the MS program.

EOU graduate-level courses will be reviewed for appropriateness of transfer into the MS program.

Courses completed prior to seven academic years before admission will be reviewed for appropriateness of transfer into the MS program.

A limit of 15 graded credits may be transferred from another accredited graduate-level institution into the MS program.
