Frequently Asked Questions

What is the time frame for EOU courses?

Courses are conducted on the OUS quarter system (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer). Online courses (indicated by a computer icon in class listings) are asynchronous; students do not need to log on at a particular time. However, students need to be proactive in checking EOU e-mail and Blackboard for information and assignment due dates. “Hybrid” FSA courses (indicated by the Oregon icon) have both an in-classroom and an online component. There will always be reading and writing assignments to complete in addition to the classroom time. Be sure to check your syllabus carefully for these requirements.

Do I need to be admitted to the university before taking FSA courses?

No, students may register for up to 8 credits per term (up to 21 credits during Summer) as a non-admitted student. To view course listings and syllabi for a term, go to [Webster](#) and click at the top on “Class Schedules and Syllabi.” Select the term and subject area. Please note the prerequisites and registration restrictions for each class.

How do I register for classes?

Registration may be done online at [Webster](#). New registrants will need to set up a ID and PIN—instructions are located on the Webster web page. Online registration will be open for Winter term through January 8, 2010. Hard copy registration will be required after that date, with the approval of the FSA Program Director.

When and how do I pay my tuition bill?

Full payment is due by the end of the second week of the term. (January 18 for Winter term) Payment may be made by credit or debit card online through Webster or by contacting the Cashier at (541) 962-3590. Payments may also be mailed in to the Student Accounts Office in La Grande. Students may wish to consider submitting the Revolving Charge Account Contract—this allows payment in installments during the term (interest will be charged on the unpaid balance.) I registered for a class and haven't heard from anyone at EOU. How do I start my class?

Students will need to log in to Blackboard and the EOU E-mail system to find correspondence, instructions and assignments from instructors. Links for these are located on the [Current Students page](#) at the EOU web site. All registered students are assigned a user name which works for both Blackboard and EOU E-mail. (Your user name can be found in your Webster account.) Further instructions are located at the Blackboard and E-mail sites. If you aren't able to log on or to locate class information, please contact us!
