Executive Summary

The Student Activities Office at Eastern Oregon University has experienced two leadership changes in three years and is in the process of experiencing yet another. As the Student Activities Office reorganizes its operations and focuses on student leadership development for students and the clubs and organizations for which they serve and are involved, it became apparent that the current activities and involvement of the Student Activities Office be assessed to identify whether or not the needs of the students are being met. In addition, the Student Activities Office is interested in soliciting recommendations for program development and improvement.

Background Information

Goals of Program

The Goals of the Student Activities Office are to assist student clubs and organizations with the success of their programs by learning new, or refining current, skills; to provide assistance to students regarding budget issues; event planning; and assessment (Appendix A). In addition, the Student Activities Office encourages all students to get involved. There are over 70 student clubs and organizations, volunteer opportunities, and student government opportunities. The Student Activities Office also assists with offering movies, concerts, lectures, and special events to the campus community.

Students Involved in Program

Students being served by the Student Activities Office are of various ages and class status – anywhere from a freshman to a senior. There are anywhere from two to fifty students in any given club or organization at a time.

Characteristics of the Program Materials Activities, and Administrative Arrangements

There are three categories that identify an association with the program (1) a club, (2) an organization, and (3) student fee funded clubs and organizations (Appendix B). Each category of association is considered either active or inactive. A club classified as an independent is not funded by the university until the club applies for recognized status and a request for funding is made. A club is not supervised by or directed by any particular unit of the institution, nor are its members paid for services rendered. An organization is classified as an administrative and functional structure of the university and is supervised by the Student Activities Office. Specific members within the organization serving in an administrative capacity are paid for their services. A student fee funded association receives funding from fees collected from students and is responsible for providing specific activities to and for students and the campus community. Members of a student fee funded association are paid for their services.

Faculty and Others Involved in the Program

Each club or organization is required to have a faculty advisor. The faculty advisor's responsibility to the club or organization, and to the students, is to facilitate educational and personal development, to provide long-term continuity within the group, to assist with the orientation of new club members, attend events and meetings, assist with setting realistic goals and objectives each year, and to assist in the justification of expenditures of students' time, abilities, energy, and dues.

Description of the Evaluation Study

Purpose of the Evaluation

The purpose of the evaluation is to determine whether or not the Student Activities Office is meeting the needs of students and the clubs and organizations for which they are a part. Specifically, the needs referred to here are in relation to the services provided to clubs and organizations as identified in Appendix A.

Evaluation Design

The evaluation designs identified for the purpose of this evaluation are both qualitative and quantitative. The qualitative data was collected through focus group meetings with clubs and organizations. A handout identifying the services provided to clubs and organizations were distributed to participants at the meeting (Appendix A). The clubs and organizations were asked the following questions:

1. Are you aware of the services provided by the Student Activities Office?
2. How often do you seek out services from the Student Activities Office?
3. Are you comfortable reaching out for assistance to the Student Activities Office?
4. Are there ways in which you feel the Student Activities Office can assist your club or organization in developing effective programming and events management?
5. What are your needs?

6. Are your needs being met?
 - a. How can your needs be met?
 - b. How can we make it happen? (Appendix C)

Comments collected during the focus group meetings assisted in the development of the quantitative survey. The survey consisted of 21 questions (Likert Scale, open answer, multiple choice, and demographic) and was implemented online. The survey questions, based upon qualitative feedback received, is provided in Appendix D.

Implementation Measures

The evaluation began with a discussion with the program administrator to determine the services provided to clubs and organizations, how the program is administered, and which clubs and organizations are serviced by the Student Activities Office. A request was made for a list of all active and inactive clubs and organizations that included the club president and faculty advisor's name and email address (Appendix A).

Upon receipt of the clubs and organizations list, an email was sent to each club president and faculty advisor of all clubs requesting their participation in the evaluation. A sample of the email sent to the club president and club advisor is identified in Appendix E. A follow-up email was sent in early January to those clubs and organizations that did not respond to the first email request. In addition, an email was sent to all organizations and student fee funded clubs and organizations requesting their participation.

The on-line survey was administered during the first four weeks of spring term 2008 and closed on May 1, 2008. The raw data was reviewed, analyzed, and the results reported later in this report. For a review of the raw data, please see Appendix H.

Results

Results of Outcome Measurement

Of the 28 emails sent to the various clubs to participate in the qualitative evaluation of the Student Activities Office services, 9 responded and 7 meetings were scheduled (Appendix F). Fifty-six students and faculty advisors participated in the quantitative online survey (Appendix H).

Results of Implementation Measurements

Results of the focus group meetings indicate that a majority of the clubs and organizations are not aware of the services provided by Student Activities; students seek services from the Student Activities Office infrequently; students are not always comfortable reaching out for assistance from the Student Activities Office; and are not sure whether or not their needs are being met (Appendix G). Students provided a plethora of ideas for which Student Activities could assist their club or organization, which were categorized into two primary concerns – communication and budget assistance. Comments collected from the students during the meetings are listed below.

1. Communication

- a. Students indicated that club notifications are limited regarding:
 - i. mandatory meetings
 - ii. club deadlines and timelines
 - iii. active clubs and leaders
 - iv. club activities and events

2. Budget Assistance

- a. Students indicated that club notifications are limited regarding:
 - i. Budget updates
 - ii. Senate allocations
 - iii. Budget procedures and policies

Suggestions received from students during the focus group discussions include:

1. Mandatory Orientation Meeting
 - a. Change “mandatory” title
 - b. Offer Orientation meeting later in the fall term (3rd week)
 - c. Offer Orientation meeting once each term
 - d. Offer Orientation meeting as a weekend course for credit
2. Schedule club events at a time other than noon (maybe on weekends or in the evenings)
3. Provide list of active clubs and their leaders
 - a. This will allow clubs and organizations to collaborate and partner up at events
4. Club News
 - a. Have a club bulletin board
 - b. Prepare a club newsletter
 - c. Have a “Club Corner” section of the Voice where club events, deadlines, etc., are published. Feature a club of the month and showcase what the club is all about and its contributions to the students and university.
 - d. Provide notifications in the Residence Halls of events, activities, and meetings
5. Senate Allocations
 - a. Provide a check sheet of things to do for allocation process
 - i. You can get senate allocations for ...
 - ii. Not allocated for ...
6. Provide a list of fundraising ideas and how to go about it
7. Make the clubs and organizations website easier to access

8. Provide information on where to get paper for posters, etc.
9. Assist with follow-up from the Club Fair (communication cards, interest lists)
10. Provide assistance with email notifications to club members by club president
11. Provide information on who students should contact if they have trouble with anything.

Participants were notified that the focus of the evaluation is not on the program administrator, however, it must be noted that many of the students indicated that the program administrator was very helpful when they requested assistance.

The results of the quantitative online survey indicate that over 92% of the students are aware of the Student Activities Office and just a little over 65% of the participants were aware of the services provided. The survey results indicate that 50% of the participants are satisfied with the services provided by the Student Activities Office and that 48.2% agree that their club or organization's needs are being met.

Taking into consideration the ideas and suggestions collected during the focus group discussions, the online survey included questions regarding website use and a message board (Questions 5 through 9). More than 53% of the participants had not visited the Clubs and Organizations website, while 87.5% agree or strongly agree that they would utilize the website for forms if the option was made available. There was strong consensus (80%) that students would utilize a message board that provided information about fundraising, recruitment, event planning, etc. In addition, 92.5% of the participants would post their club or organization activities on a message board.

There was an overwhelming response to Question 10 – all clubs and organizations would benefit from a master calendar of events, with a rating of 98.2% (76.8% strongly agree, 21.4% agree). Over 90% of the participants would like to utilize a Club Corner section of the student newspaper for dissemination of information.

During the focus group discussions, it was determined that many of the club officers were not aware of or unable to attend the mandatory club meeting during the first week of fall term. Questions 13-16 of the online survey addressed the issue and the responses reveal that 66.1% of the participants would make up the mandatory session if it was offered again within the year; 53.6% of the participants were neutral with regard to their preference of whether or not the mandatory session was held the first or third week of the fall term; while 57.9% (35.7% agree and 23.2% strongly agree) would prefer the mandatory orientation be offered every term.

Students indicate that they are very interested in workshops regarding organizational development (69.6%) and identified the following five topics as their priority:

1. Fundraising (72.5%)
2. Event Planning (70.6%)
3. Communication (62.7%)
4. Teambuilding (58.8%)
5. Leadership Styles (56.9%)

The survey results further indicate that 76.9% of the participants are satisfied with the services provided by the faculty advisor of their club or organization. Questions 20 and 21 were open ended, comment questions (Appendix I). The results are very similar to those received and identified above during the focus group discussions.

Discussion of Results

The findings indicate that student clubs and organizations are being served adequately. However, proactive efforts with regard to informing clubs and organizations of the services offered by the Student Activities Office will result in more utilization and more effective student development and involvement. In addition, students are very interested in workshops related to fundraising, leadership development, communication enhancements and event planning.

Conclusion and Recommendations

As the Student Activities Office reviews the program delivery and leadership program as it relates to student activities and student development, consideration of the information provided in this evaluation will be of assistance when determining the appropriate revisions necessary for the program to meet the needs of the students. The findings reveal that outreach and communication are two areas that need to be addressed. Overall, students are aware of the services offered. Student participants in this program evaluation look forward to working with the Student Activities Office in the near future as they seek to develop their leadership skills.

Appendix A

Eastern Oregon University Student Activities Office

Services Provided to Clubs and Organizations

The Student Activities Office provides assistance to both recognized and non-recognized clubs and organizations of Eastern Oregon University. A recognized club is one that has applied for and received such standing, has developed a constitution, and is eligible for allocation of funds for the enhancement of the club/organization. A non-recognized club is one that is active but has not applied for recognized status. A non-recognized club is not eligible for funding allocations.

- How to become a recognized club
 - Benefits of establishing a recognized club
- Training about:
 - Day to day operations protocols and the operation of a club
 - Budget issues
 - Student employees and time sheet information

 - How to conduct a meeting
 - How to take minutes
 - How to communicate
- Budget carry forwards and balances at first meeting of the school year
- Fund raising and raffle reporting and ticket generation
- Parking information
- Event planning and management
 - Scheduling
 - Food service
 - Marketing/publicity
 - Risk management (alcohol and safety issues)
- Offers manuals for clubs and the faculty advisors
- Bulk mailing and email mailing assistance

Additional assistance provided to recognized clubs/ organizations are:

- Budget assistance with:
 - Distribution of monthly budget status
 - Budget development assistance
 - Budget advising/ reimbursements/ accounts payable information
- Finance assistance with:
 - Senate allocation information
 - Operations manual generation
 - Food vending
- Assessment assistance
 - How well does a program or event measure up, etc.

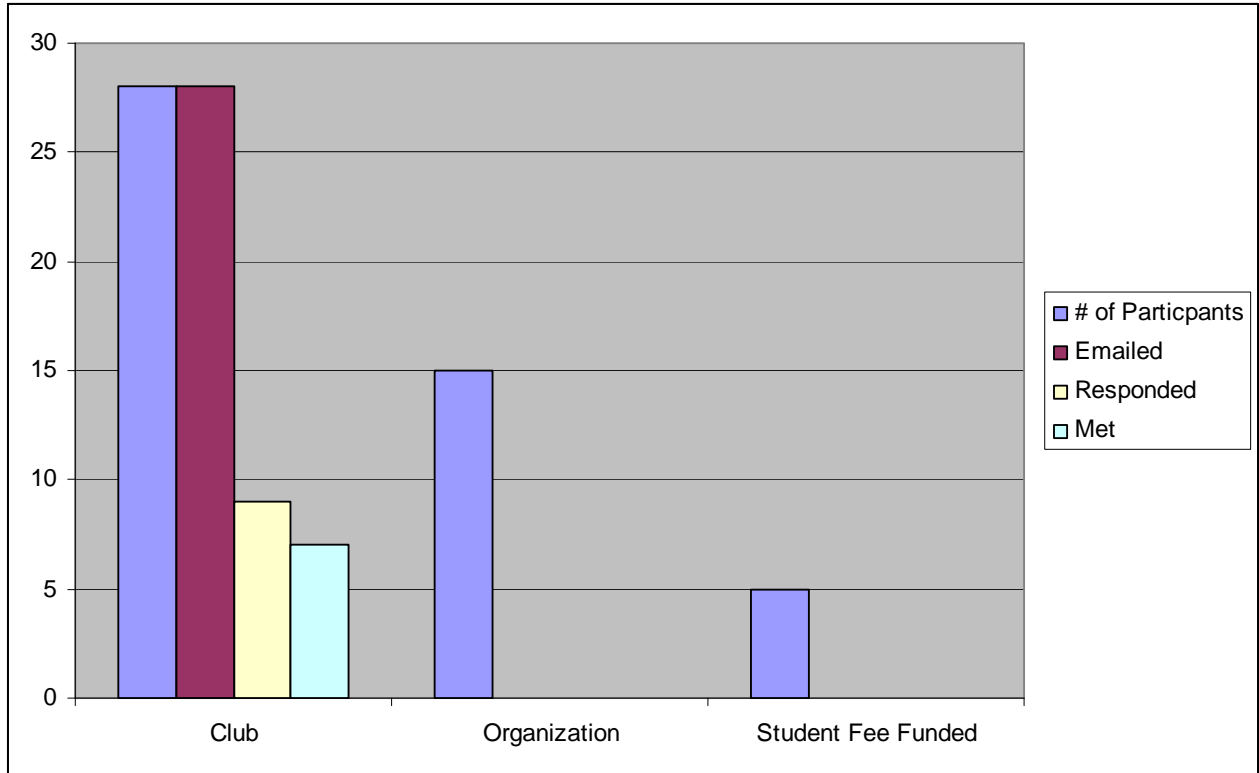

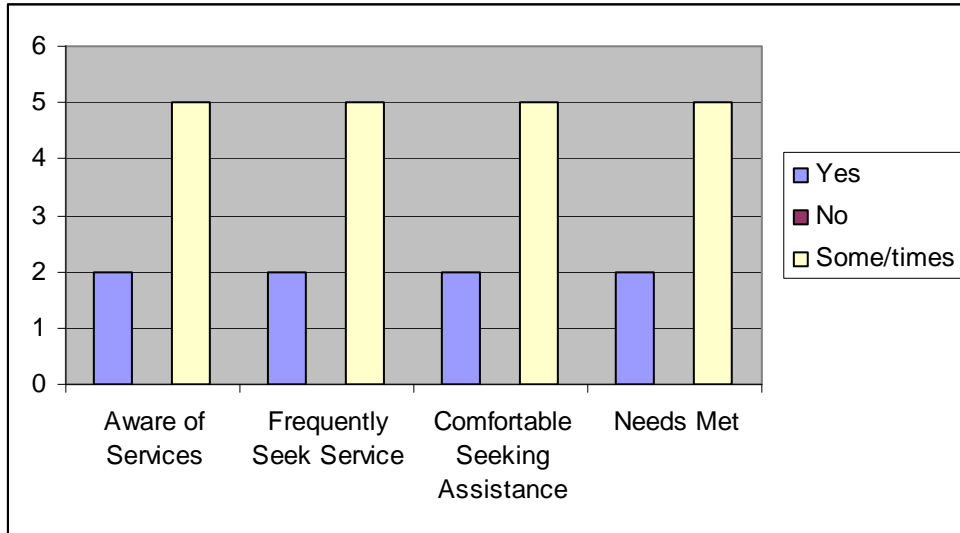

Awareness and Needs Outcomes**


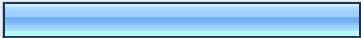




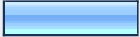



