- 1. Statement from your parent(s)
 - If your parents refuse to provide financial information on your FAFSA, their signed statement must state either:
 - 1) Their refusal to complete the parental section of a FAFSA on your behalf; or
 - 2) (A) They have stopped providing financial support to you (including the date when the financial support stopped); and (B) Will not provide financial support in the future.
 - If your parents completed their portion of your FAFSA, but refuse to complete the verification process (if selected), their signed statement must state:
 - 1) (A) They have stopped providing financial support to you (including the date when the financial support stopped); and (B) Will not provide financial support in the future.
 - If you are unable to obtain the parental statement, provide a letter from a responsible adult who is aware of your situation and can describe the nature of your relationship with your parents.
- 2. Optional: Statement from you describing: (A) Nature of your relationship with your parents; (B) Location of both parents and when you last had contact with them; (C) Why you cannot obtain information and/or support from your parents; and (D) How you have been supporting yourself financially.
