

Summary of G4O3KPI123 to date (07.15.18)

A Project Scoping Team was formed in the winter of 2018 to develop evaluation criteria, supporting evidence, and a monitoring and tracking process for these KPI's. The Project Scoping Team first meeting attempted to define the subjective features of these KPI's, specifically "well-maintained, accessible", "beautiful setting", and campus use is "maximized." The team determined that opinions on the features vary and that any developed process should capture varying opinions. Further, team members discussed that these KPI's should be monitored and tracked with the master planning documents and use survey results to monitor success after items are implemented. The Team will be re-started this fall with the goal of developing the processes for monitoring and tracking by early 2019.

While the Team has only met once, Professor Bill Grigsby discussed a class project for the Spring 2018 term with the Facilities and Planning Department. The class project used EOU's geodatabase and other mapping tools to define landscaping features and conducted an in-depth online survey. On June 27, 2018 Grigsby shared the survey data with the Facilities & Planning Department which will then be shared with the Project Scoping Team. Further, Professor Grigsby was asked to be part of the Project Scoping Team, to which he agreed to attend when his availability allows. The survey results are considered a key component in the scoping process as well as establishing monitoring and tracking processes.
