

ACCESS FOR ALL

- The Oregon Teacher Pathway (OTP) is a grow-your-own-teacher program that is designed to:
 - 1) recruit, educate, and graduate culturally and linguistically diverse students who are interested in becoming teachers.
 - 2) recruit, educate, and graduate students interested in learning how to become culturally responsive teachers.
- The program begins with training high schools students in their junior and senior year by offering dual-credit courses in introduction to education and culturally responsive practices. Students also are involved in a 1-hour per week field experience tutoring elementary school students.



OVER 90 YEARS OF EQUIPPING OREGON EDUCATORS

- Students who participate in the OTP program will qualify for a tuition discount. In return these students agree to become mentors for high school students in their home communities and fellow college students pursuing teacher education.
