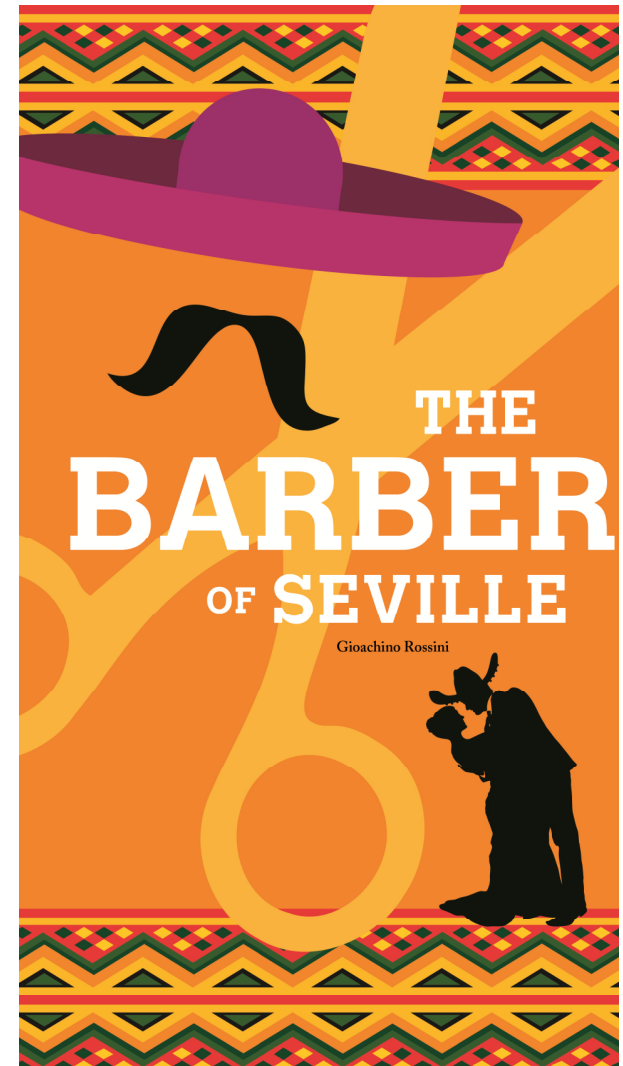

Portland Opera To Go is currently booking for our 2015 touring production of Rossini's *The Barber of Seville*. Our 50-minute, bilingual adaptation of Rossini's classic is a magnificent way to experience opera for the first time. Designed specifically for school age audiences, our adaptation of *The Barber of Seville* retains all of the humor and hijinks of Rossini's original with an accessible, vibrant staging sure to engage, delight and inspire your classes.

The price is \$1.50 per child in attendance or \$100 whichever is greater, and includes curriculum designed to meet the Oregon Benchmarks and Common Core State Standards, with lesson plans geared for upper primary and secondary grades. In addition, our artists will visit up to 5 selected classrooms an hour prior to show time for half hour of additional instruction.
